What makes Housing, Good Housing?

People with an intellectual disability participated in the AMIDA Housing and Self Advocacy Conference on 29th April 1989

This is what they said about housing.

Good Housing is:

- Good quality building (no leaks etc),
- Affordable (so you can pay for your housing and still have enough money to eat and have fun),
- Secure (you can stay as long as you want),
- Comfortable, safe and happy (you feel comfortable, safe and happy in your place),
- Good location (close to shops, places you like to go etc),
- Allows you to have your rights (eg your right to have privacy, your own money, visitors etc),
- Choice (so you can choose the sort of place that is best for you, and choose who you live with),
- Not stigmatizing or different (so people don't walk past and say "that house is especially for disabled people"),
- Equitable, just and fair (<u>everyone</u> should have good housing. Housing should not be provided in a way that makes some people miss out),
- Allows you to have support you want (no more/no less).

In a nutshell, what people with a disability want in their housing is just the same as what we all want!
